

PERUSAL

Mother Moon For Soprano, Alto, Baritone and Electronics

Mother Moon explores the juxtaposing concepts of time and timelessness through the everpresent satellite orbiting our planet, the moon. It also explores the cultural, religious, temporal, mythological and semantic significance humans have attributed to moon throughout the ages.

The electronic track is designed to represent the strictly timed phases of the moon, each 'phase' is 10 bars at crotchet = 70, or 33 seconds long. In phases 1, 2, 3, 7, 8 and 9, the vocal parts sit on top of the strict phases as a representation of timelessness. These vocal parts are not to be whispered or sung strictly to time, but rather as the music is *felt* within each 33 second section. Phases 4, 5 and 6, (as well as section lines in Phases 7 and 8) have measured musical material that are to be performed strictly at dotted crotchet and crotchet = 70; the pulse remains the same.

The conductor will have a click track to play in their ear at 70bpm. The click will have 2 introductory bars of 4/4 before the piece begins. Both the track and the click track must be started at the same time; two bars of silence has been built into the electronic track for ease of performance.

Please be aware of the spatial limits of the score, some of the phases last one stanza or two stanzas due to length of musical material.

Boxed timing references throughout the score refer to both the click track and electronic track.

Performer Notes

Note-heads:

- x Whispered
- Sung

Phase 3 (and 7):

- Held consonants on a 'sung notehead' denote a sung consonant at pitch. Eg. 'Th'
- Held 'R', as in 'b \underline{R} -ight' should be rolled at pitch
- Whisper 'su' from Mea-<u>su</u>-res as 'sh'

Text:

The text was constructed by Áine Mallon. It is a compilation of single words taken from poems across time. The oldest poem is dated 610-570 BC with the most recent being the composers own addition in 2022. This was to convey an incredible expansiveness and to further the idea of the timeless moon, and how every human who has existed is connected to it.

She dances on the sea; The tidal water waves. She sails through windy skies, Pulling the tides.

The bright air-grail lowers a path to lead you. She waxes / She wanes and rests and measures the time

Isolate; pale queen of the silent night.

















S/A: Individually introduce whispered text; less energy; unvoiced and overlapping Vary tempo and rhythm Elongate 's' and 'sh' sounds
